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Profile: Aluvan Truck & Trailer Bodies



At the recent IAA exhibition in Hanover, Aluvan (whose group name is International Van) had some interesting news. MD Philippe Vanlander explained how the company had altered and grown since their MBO

in 1995. In 1998 the company set up a new manufacturing facility in Poland, where they now employ 150 people in 22000m². In 1999 PolyPan began, and now offers a wide range of composite panels together with a range of insulated panel body kits for light commercial vehicles. This spin-off led to the birth of the Aluvan division, PolyVan in 2000. At the beginning of this year, the company acquired the roller shutter manufacturing activities of James and Bloom, which will be known as International Van UK Ltd.

Mr Vanlander summarised the company's achievement with some statistics - 800 customers in 40 countries; turnover this year of more than €25mn; 400 employees at 3 sites.

PolyPan Launches PiraPano

PolyPan has launched a new lightweight omposite panel called PiraPano. Available in two weights, it has a pyramid-shaped synthetic blend core and the outer surfaces can be a variety of laminate materials. The new panel material has good compression strength, high deformation resistance, excellent stiffness and it's lightweight, 50%

lighter than plywood. It is compatible with all known bodybuilding profile systems.



One of the first users of the new panel was German bodybuilder Wecon, who use it for the construction of rear doors.
